ATTENDANCE

School attendance is a top priority for our current government, who have an increased emphasis on trying to ensure students are attending school as often as possible.

This "<u>Attendance Information Sheet</u>" gives some further information around attendance. "Regular" attendance is classified as missing no more than 5 days per term. Only 54% of New Zealand students managed "Regular" attendance in Term 4 of 2023. As the sheet explains, while 5 days a term doesn't seem much, when looked at over the course of their schooling this equates to an entire year's education.


